To Whom it May Concern:

This letter is for the purpose of introducing you to the House of Hope, a 24 bed recovery house for alcoholic men in Alamogordo, N.M.

Open since August of 2006, our mission objective is to provide a safe environment for and to serve in the recovery process of alcoholic men. We provide a secure and structured sober living environment focusing on responsibility, enterprise, and character for rebuilding the lives of newly sober alcoholic men.

We require our residents to attend a combination of six AA/NA meetings a week if dually addicted. Although our focus is alcoholic men, we understand that many have used other drugs as well. However we do not accept drug addicts who do not also have problems with alcohol. We require our residents to secure a sponsor and work with them weekly in the recovery process.

We are governed by a nine member Board of Directors, and are recognized by the IRS as a 501c3. We are served by a full time Chief Administrator, Deputy Administrator, and a live in Residential Manager.

Our residents are required to find employment to pay their room and board and to follow resident policies. We conduct random UA's and breathalyzers, and enforce the policies across the board.

Our residents come from in-patient treatment facilities, de-tox centers, correctional facilities, DWI programs, judges, and attorneys from across the state of New Mexico. Occasionally an alcoholic man will seek us out himself, looking for a structured sober living environment to get a new start in life.

Our program is from six months to one year in length. The intent is to furnish these individuals with the necessary tools to live clean and sober, and to help them become productive, contributing members of the community once more.

The cost for residency is \$165 weekly, which covers room, board, and laundry facilities. We require incoming residents to pay two weeks rent in advance when they first come in. This enables them to have two weeks in which to find employment. Alamogordo has been very supportive of our residents.

Residents who are on parole or probation must provide the house with the name of their PO. If a resident is dismissed from our program for noncompliance or absconds, we notify the office immediately.

We welcome questions, inspections, and visits from anyone interested in our facility and what we can offer to our residents.
